1	<b>Alice in Wonderland</b>	16.01-18.12	Alice in Wonderland will be the largest exhibition of contemporary art photography ever seen in Finland. The event will provide a link between international trends and world-renowned Finnish photographic art.	
2	<b>Fire! Fire!</b>	16.01-18.12	The self-portrayal exhibition of the Capital of Culture year takes the visitor into a sensory immersion in the world of flames. The exhibition describes the many meanings of fire and provides new and original exhibition experiences... A key theme at the exhibition will be the destructive Great Fire of Turku in 1827. The exhibition will present the city's fire in from a Nordic, a European and a Global point of view.

5	<b>Tom of Finland</b>	16.01-18.12	Many people will be surprised to learn that arguably the most internationally acclaimed Finnish artist comes from Kaarina, a neighbouring town to Turku. Now, Tom of Finland alias Touko Laaksonen (1920-1991) is coming home!	Gay pornography
6	<b>Turun Anikistit</b>	08.04-29.05 (closed at 5pm)	During the spring, animators from the Turun Anikistit Association will present their own collection of animations. Turun Anikistit consist of eleven animators from Turku.	
7	<b>Last Supper exhibition</b>	17.04-31.07	Turku Cathedral, the Finnish national sanctuary, offers an unparalleled venue for an art exhibition, where the secular and the spiritual worlds come together in the spirit of the Last Supper.	Might be considered profanation by practicing Christians
8	<b>Antspotting routes</b>	01.05-31.08	Get to know your local environment on paths shown by ants! Antspotting route will be launched in May in Mälikkälä, Ruissalo, Turku	
9	<b>Artist as neighbour month</b>	01.05-31.05	Programme highlights include Susanna Peijari's game Suburban Memory, Flora Metamorphicae's field of ceramic flowers, neighbourhood bicycle trips, Instant Souvenir workshops and library clubs in local libraries.	
10	<b>Faith, Hope and Love</b>	01.05-28.08	The Ecumenical Art Chapel will organize a joint exhibition featuring works from four esteemed Spanish artists. The invited artists include sculptor Diego Canogar, art painter Totte Mannes, academician-sculptor Jose Luis Sanchez and academician-sculptor Dario Villalba.	
11	<b>WÄINÖ! Sculpture Exhibition 2011</b>	03.05-26.06	The Wäinö! exhibition will showcase the talents and visions of both established and novice sculptors. Wäinö! will extend the range of exhibitions on display during the Capital of Culture year by focusing on sculpture and highlighting the skills and narrative talent of a new generation of sculptors.	
12	<b>City remembered</b>	09.05-12.06	Based on the city history and these almost-forgotten memories, a pedestrian route will be created in central Turku. The route will be enhanced with audio and text, which can be seen as individual stories or as a connected narrative. City Remembered will also be turned into a map to follow the route, which will also be a part of the Central Park of Culture and Exercise project.	
13	<b>Inner landscapes</b>	20.05-25.09	Two Japanese and a Finnish artist will create an exhibition featuring ceramics, photographs and video that will present a very personal take on Turku's history and how it relates to the present day.	
14	<b>Performanssi 2011</b>	27.05-29.05 (closed at 9pm)	The international festival of performance art will stage planned and impromptu performances – indoors, outdoors and on the web.	
15	<b>Rocking chair get-together</b>	28.05 (?) no info on time	Dozens of comfortable rocking chairs will invite visitors to the banks of River Aura. Take a moment to gently rock in the chair and feel your thoughts flow, allowing you to rediscover the city.	
16	<b>Spot the Oliopus Olius!</b>	29.05 (?) no info on time	Spot the Oliopus Olius! is a children's puppet theatre performance on the wonders of nature. Along the way, the interaction between humans and their surroundings will be emphasised and natural phenomena will be experienced as a part of the artwork.
